It also allowed parents to speak with other parents and find out about using visuals, Zones of Regulation, Lego Therapy alongside input from Occupational Therapy. Students enjoy spending time with Morag on a Friday and has been an important part of helping students regulate. She has been a great addition to the team and we look forward to more students getting to spend time with her next term.
