Our topics this half term have been Victorians and Celebrities, both of which were chosen by the class! A highlight from Victorians has to be our work on Jack the Ripper. Every single person was engaged and asking lots of questions and producing a fantastic quality of work. Celebrities has been a great opportunity to engage with our pupils' interests and letting them lead what we study! This was all topped off with a well-earned trip to the park! # KS3 – Class LM 'Letters from the Lighthouse'

Class EM have had another really enjoyable term together! During Spring Term 1, in English we read 'Letters from the Lighthouse' as our class novel which we were really gripped by. This was a story about refugees during the Second World War and their fight to help save other refugees. This linked nicely with our Humanities topic of World War Two.

## **World War Two**

We learnt about the causes of WW2 and the effects that this had on the people of that time, especially the children. We built Anderson Shelters in Design Technology using old boxes and junk modelling materials. We had to think carefully about the structure of our shelters and how we could attach the pieces together.



# **Shakespeare**

During Spring Term 2, we learnt about William Shakespeare and read Romeo and Juliet, looking at some of the Shakespearian words and phrases and what they meant.



# **Ancient Egypt**

In humanities, we learnt about Ancient Egypt, Mummification, Pharaohs and pyramids. We looked at hieroglyphs and how to write our name in the ancient Egyptian symbols and designed and made our own clay cartouches.





#### Maths

In Maths, we have been looking at data collection and presenting data in charts and graphs, measurements and time.

This term we have enjoyed learning all about transport, one student in particular enjoyed telling their classmates all about Speedway. We have been learning about statistics data and various graphs and charts and how to visually represent data using beads, cubes and even pom poms!

We had a fantastic trip to the Cinema to see an Anime film and have enjoyed our weekly visits to Discover and using the hammocks.

The class have all played well together during indoor PE and there have been some very competitive games of indoor bowls and curling which has gone down very well with the class. As always, the students have engaged well with their lessons and have taken pride in their work.

## **Absences Reminder**


If your child is absent from school, please call the school office before 9am.


