Plants

This first summer half term we have been learning about Plants. Within this topic the students have learned about all the different parts of a plant and the function of these parts. Their ability to retain the information they have learned and then use this in their next lesson has greatly improved this half term. The explored students have different needs of a plant and what happens if these needs aren't met. Every student planted their own sunflower seed, it was a pleasure to see how well they cared for them and made sure they had all the things they needed to thrive and grow. Living Creatures and Habitats

This half term students have been learning about living things and their habitats. Our playing field swings are being replaced over the holidays which are a well used resource for students.


Forest School
