Head Teacher's Update:

A huge thank you to the Hillcrest community for making this Spring term so enjoyable. We have some AMAZING young people, incredible families, supportive governors and staff who work in a skilled way with our young people every single day. A lot to be thankful for.

Schools are the most exciting place to be because of the variety of activities that take place both inside and outside of school. All of which is shared with you here. This term I was able to be a Geordie Juliet with Mr Brady's class which is something I never had the pleasure to do in 29 years of working in schools.

We start every Monday morning in staff briefing sharing Magic Moments from the week before. This ensures that all staff get to hear about the great things that happen across school on a weekly basis and this really is a wonderful way to start the working week.

KS3 – Class LM The Flying Frogs

During Spring Term 1 we studied the book Tuesday by David Wiesner and produced some fantastic Newspaper articles based on the story. We imagined that we were journalists investigating the case of the flying frogs. We interviewed each other and typed up our reports. Our watercolour frog paintings finished our display off perfectly!



Makaton

We worked really hard with Mrs Eggett to learn Makaton and achieve our Makaton Level 1 Award. Our class enjoyed learning and practicing then we performed 'Sweet Caroline' with the Makaton signs to Mrs Mead, the Head Teacher.



Shakespeare

During Spring Term 2, we studied William Shakespeare and read Romeo and Juliet, looking at some of the Shakespearian words and phrases and what they meant. We had great fun reading with expression and practicing different voices to share Shakespearean insults!

Discover

We really enjoyed our music sessions in Discover! We have been learning songs so we can participate in 'The Big Gig', singing in rounds, playing rhythm games and experimenting with instruments.



School Visits

We had a lovely day out at Northumberlandia; we walked around the lady, played some games, had a picnic and built a Class EM den in the woods. We have enjoyed a visit to the Fire Station to learn about the careers and jobs available within the Fire Service and even got to use the hose pipes on the engines!



Science

In Science we have been learning all about electricity. Did you know that a lemon can power a circuit? We made our own circuit powered by lemons and added more and more lemons to make the buzzer even louder!



KS3 – Class MP Crime and Punishment

This term we have been working really hard on our topics Crime and Punishment and The Environment.

In Spring 1, we focused on History and looked at Crime and Punishment during different eras. As a part of this, we were able to take a trip to the Great North Museum: Hancock. This was a great opportunity to look through the different historical exhibits as well as handling some of the Ancient Greek soldier equipment. We also solved the case of the stolen cookies by looking at clues and different sources to investigate.



The Environment

In Spring 2, we focused on The Environment for Geography. We have done some fieldwork which involved going down to Discover and doing some litter picking as well as looking at recycling and different land use in the North-East.

Fantastic Work

Some other highlights have been the amazing work on Macbeth that the class have completed for English. We have done a range of speaking and listening activities after reading parts of the book such as hot seating and a 'talk show' activity where the class interviewed each other as they played different characters. Additionally, there has been some fantastic written work completed such as summaries of the story, persuasive letters and reports written all themed around the book. We have also had the opportunity to go on other trips such as Pets at Home and the cinema. Overall, this has been a great term and we are looking forward to the summer term!



KS3 – Class GM Lots Of Learning

This half term the students have enjoyed learning all about Shakespeare's A Midsummer Night's dream and all the different characters and plot twists.

In Maths, Class GM have been working hard learning all about times tables and inverse operations and the commutative law.

In Science we have learned about electricity and how to make our own circuits using electrical equipment and other resources such as moulding clay and lemons (instead of batteries).

In Art, we have linked the work to our topic regarding ancient Latin American civilisations such as Mayans, Aztecs and Incas and also discovering how these were later usurped by the Spanish and Portuguese conquistadors.

New Music

All of the students have enjoyed using the new instruments, learning tunes such as 'Ode to Joy' on the Keyboard, 'Smoke on the Water' on the Ukuleles and 'The wheels on the bus' on the xylophone!!



The students have also enjoyed two visits to the cinema, one visit to Pets at Home plus weekly visits to the local park (for races on the zipwire!!).

As always, the students of class GM have worked really hard and have been kind and respectful to one another.

Generous donations have given the school the opportunity to offer each student an Easter egg to enjoy.


