Solidarity Farm

Our class novel, Secrets of a Sun King, which linked to our Humanities topic on Ancient Egypt, really kept us on the edge of seats and desperate to read the next chapter to find out if the curse could be lifted from Lillian's Grandad! We produced some fantastic pieces of writing using this book as inspiration.



Makaton

We have really enjoyed working with Mrs Eggett to achieve our Makaton Level One and Level Two awards. We have thoroughly enjoyed our summer term and have experienced lots of new things!





KS3 – Class MP Maturity and Resilience

The summer has been a fantastic final term of the year. I have been really proud of the progress that I have seen in the class's maturity and resilience. Some highlights in Maths and English were seeing everybody engaged in class discussions and debates together and applying some practical Maths knowledge for the preparation of raising money for our class trip. We have also enjoyed lots of fun Thrive activities such as making slime, den building and spending time down in Discover.





Romans

For the first half term, our topic was the Romans, where we looked at gladiators, the colosseum, Boudicca and the Roman Empire. As well, we completed some great art projects alongside this.



In the second half term, we looked at Animals Across the World, where we focused on our Geographical knowledge of continents, countries and oceans and where some animals live. This also included the adaptations they have made to survive in those places and the class created their own creatures with adaptations too.

It has been a pleasure to work with everybody in Class MP this year and I know they will go on to do amazing things next year. Enjoy the summer!

KS3 – Class GM Lots of Learning

This summer term we have been learning all about the concept of time, from measuring the time of day using the sun and shadows to the introduction of analogue clocks with the Victorian railways and how Greenwich Meantime was introduced. We have looked at different time zones around the world and converted from analogue time to digital. The students have done great work with this often tricky concept!

World War 2

In English and Humanities we have been investigating World War 2, the key events and people, who was on the Allies and who was on the Axis, why it began and how it ended. We have learned about key figures during the war and the role women had to play such as fashion designer Coco Chanel and the underground French Resistance movement.

Art and Design

As always, we have linked these topics to cross curriculum subjects such as Art and Design and the students have produced some amazing work to go on our 'display corridor'. My personal favourite was the use of pastels and chalks to produce sketches of Stonehenge with shadows forming during the Summer Solstice.

We have enjoyed playing the new instruments such as Trombones and the Brazilian Samba Drum set.

The students have enjoyed our visits to the local parks, learning life skills in the community at local shops and supermarkets, enjoying the new 'sensory garden' in Cramlington and weekly sessions in our Discover area.

The students have had a great summer term and should be very proud of all the work they have produced and the friendships they have maintained and expanded.



KS3 – Class CB A Special Thank you

As we come to the end of a fantastic school year, I'd like to extend a heartfelt thank you to all our pupils and parents for making it so special. It has been a joy to watch the children grow academically, socially, and emotionally.

Exciting Topics

It has been a wonderful year in Class JP! We have grown so much together and this last term has shown us how far we have come.


School Garden
